GREAT YARMOUTH CLUB PRESENTED WITH FREEDOM OF THE BOROUGH AWARD.





The Mayor of Great Yarmouth, Councillor Penny Carpenter, said: "Over many decades the Great Yarmouth Lions Club has done a huge amount of good.' Its charitable achievements are too many to mention, but people will be particularly aware of the Santa Sleigh it runs at Christmas that brings joy to the town and raises vital money for good causes. We are delighted to honour Great Yarmouth Lions Club with the Freedom of the Borough, and on behalf of the council, I would like to thank the club for its service to the community."



Since its formation, some of the club's most significant achievements have included preparing Christmas dinners for the lonely, providing books for schools, its ambassador programme and raising awareness around period poverty. There is even a blue plaque in Gorleston to mark the site of a holiday home which the Lions Club ran to offer sponsored breaks for partially sighted and blind people. The club, which is twinned with its French counterpart in Rambouillet, currently has 21 members of all ages and the longest-serving member has been involved with the group for more than 50 years.



International Projects 105CE - Diabetes awareness

One Person is Diagnosed Every Two Minutes.

There are around 5 million people with diabetes in the UK, which is 1 in 15 people.

Around 90% of people with diabetes have type 2 diabetes.

Around 8% of people with diabetes have type 1 diabetes.

About 2% of people with diabetes have rarer types of diabetes.



Fundraising has helped Diabetes UK support those living with diabetes and their families. They have reached over 75,000 people with their "Learning Zone" courses, with 83% of users saying they are more confident managing their diabetes.

Aided frontline service support, "Learning Zone" support line and the website (online resource materials) provide access to those who require it most.

DIABETES IS RELENTLESS, BUT SO ARE WE, says Diabetes UK.

Diabetes UK do not receive any Government funding, it relies on supporters like the Lions Clubs International.

Lions clubs organise tree planting programmes in the communities, encourage reforestation, protect peatlands. Lions get together with partnerships, like local councils to carry out small but effective projects, for example cleaning up a neglected area or litter picking in their local areas beach cleaning. It could be a fun day out doing good at the same time.

Lions are bringing awareness to their communities by setting an example with their projects. Lions Logo on high vis tabards gets you noticed.

With the help of your club you can make a tremendous difference, it may be small but it has an impact collectively, every drop makes the ocean.

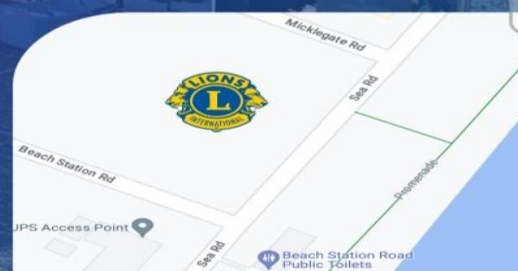
